

# Donor Days A Hit

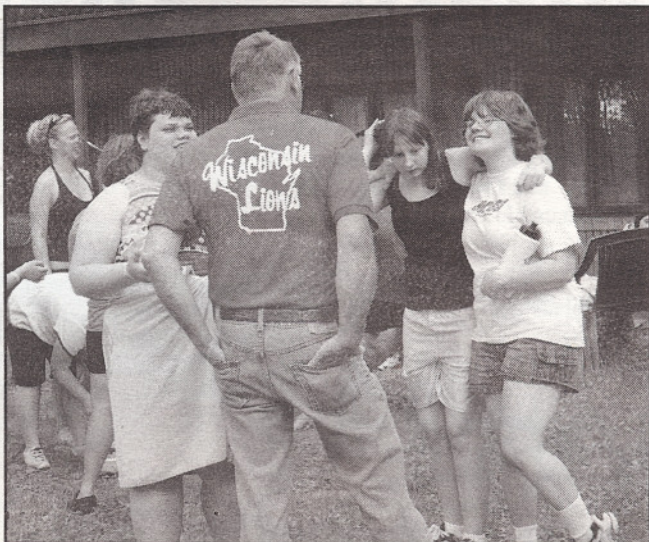
